Jim Knox's Wild Zoofari

In Jim Knox's Wild Zoofari, wildlife expert Jim Knox, leads a group of kids — the Zoofari Explorers — on an exploration of the country's premier zoos and aquariums. In each episode, the Explorers identify a "mystery creature" from a series of clues about a particular animal's features, diet, habitat and adaptations. In addition to highlighting wildlife conservation projects, special episodes focus on specific topics or types of animals, such as the "Great Cats" or "Mega Creatures."

Miffy and Friends

The iconic white bunny from Dick Bruna's children's book classics comes to life in this 3D stopmotion animated series. Miffy, along with her friends Boris and Barbara Bear, Melanie the bunny, Poppy and Grunty Pig, and Snuffy the Dog, takes preschoolers along for adventures exploring basic concepts and themes. A female narrator, sounding like a child's favorite teacher, guides viewers through the action.

Peep & the Big Wide World

The series follows a newly hatched chicken named Peep and his friends Chirp, a smart and sassy robin, and Quack, an endearingly egotistical duck, as they embark on a series of wide-ranging adventures. Narrated by award-winning comedian Joan Cusack, each episode contains two stories which highlight specific science concepts. In addition, two live-action shorts present real kids playing and experimenting with these concepts in their own "big wide worlds."
